

Reception – Week beg 18th May - school closure activity ideas to try at home.

Here are some activities that your child can be doing at home this week. The blue links below are from the twinkl website. As we are not in school and using our usual reward system, we will be giving dojo points out as rewards for children whose parents send photos of them doing some of the activities mentioned below. This will continue until we are back at school when we will return to our usual system. There will be a prize for the child with the most dojo points so get sending me those photos mams!

Literacy – Reading, Writing

This week at school would have been learning all about The Three Little Pigs story. At home you could:-

- Read the story together. (lots on you tube)
- Talk about what happened first, next, after that and at the end.

- Encourage your child to write short sentences to retell the story. Encourage them to sit writing on the line, use finger spaces between words, spell words themselves using the phonic sounds they can hear and to finish with a full stop. Always encourage your child to read back what they have written to check it makes sense.

- Act out the story in your house or garden. Different family members could be the different characters in the story.

Maths

Counting objects accurately up to 20.

Fill in missing numbers on number lines to 20 going forwards and backwards. You could write number lines out for them with a line for them to write in the missing numbers.

1 __ 3 __ 6 7 __ 10 etc

Can they explain to you how they know? Can they do it backwards?

20 __ 18 __ 16 __ 13 __ 11 __ etc

Can they do it if the number line starts at different numbers?

8 __ 10 11 __ 14

13 __ 15 __ 17 18 __

Now we have explored pairs of numbers that make 10. This week try using the same equipment, coins, pasta, lego bricks, sweets to find and make pairs of numbers for 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9.

e.g. Give your child 6 bricks and 2 plates. Can they explore by sharing the bricks between the 2 plates to make different calculations that always make 6. Can they write each calculation down as they go?

E.g. $6 + 0 = 6$. Repeat for other numbers up to 10.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

Minibeasts – learn all about slugs, snails and worms this week. Share the powerpoint below to learn some interesting facts.

- Learn and practice reading words with the ee sound this week. (sheep, feet,) Use the sheets below to practice spelling words with this sound.

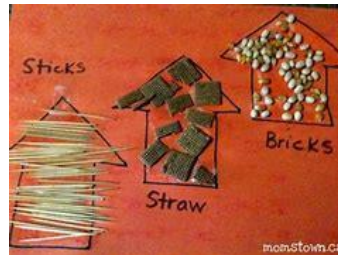
