


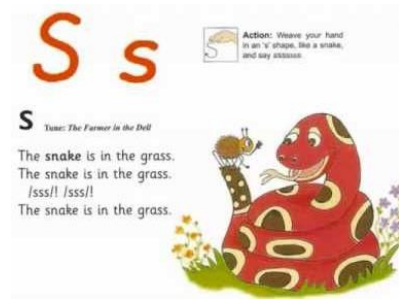


Nursery's Remote Learning Plan- 18.1.21

	Something to read ...	Something to make ...	Something to sing ...	Something to count ...
What will my child be learning?	<p>I can join in with my favourite stories and guess what will happen next.</p> <p>I know that stories have beginnings and endings and sometimes I guess how the story will end.</p> <p>I can listen to longer stories and talk about them.</p> <p>I can talk about the places and people in stories and the important things that are happening.</p> <p>I like to look at the pictures and words in books. I can show you words when we are outdoors.</p>	<p>I can use all sorts of building toys and empty cardboard boxes to make things.</p> <p>I make lines and piles of blocks, joining the pieces together to make things like houses and car parks.</p> <p>I know that I can use tools like scissors, spoons and hammers to do different things.</p>	<p>I can sing some familiar songs.</p> <p>I like joining in with dancing and ring games.</p> <p>I am beginning to move with rhythm, especially when I hear music I like.</p>	<p>I can use some number names and words like "more than" and "fewer than", when I am playing.</p> <p>I can say numbers in order from 1 to 10.</p> <p>I know that numbers tell me how many things there are altogether, like 8 biscuits on a plate.</p>
Magic Maths Monday	<p>Read 'Cool cars' by Tony Mitton and Ant Parker (our authors of the week). It's a lovely rhyming book with some great illustrations that looks at a range of different cars.</p>  <p>https://youtu.be/2EQFJfzu68k</p>	<p>Have a go at making a road for your vehicles. Children love to work on large scale drawing so if you have any rolls of paper like unwanted wall paper or wrapping paper then use the other side and let them go wild!</p> 	<p>Sing 'ten green bottles'. This is not a song that we've sang at nursery yet so your child may need to learn it. Here's a youtube link to help</p> <p>https://youtu.be/rPCzwqbFAn0</p>	<p>If you have some cars/ vehicles, have a go at numbering them. You could make a simple car park using just a pen and piece of paper. Draw dots in each parking space for your child to count then match the car to the correct parking space.</p> 

Terrific Talkers Tuesday

This is the first of our online phonics sessions where we will be introducing letter sounds. Today the sound is 's'. Please watch the youtube clip below which introduces the letter. Then talk to your child about the sound. Can they find any objects around the house that begins with 's'. Can they have a go at writing it?

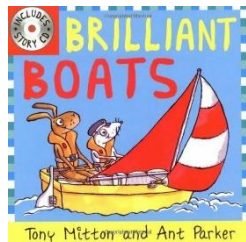
Create a surface for your child to practice mark making such as shaving foam, sand, lentils, rice. Can they use their finger to write their name? form numbers? Write today's sound?

Have another go at "I went to the shops and I bought a....."
The idea is to take turns with your child, adding something to the shopping list each time. Each person has to remember everything on the list in the right order before adding their own item. This is great for your child's communication and language skills!!

How many things can you do in a minute? Time your child for one minute and set them different challenges like jumping/ clapping/ walking to the kitchen and back. Get them to count how many they can do in a minute.

Another Tony Mitton and Ant Parker book. This time it's 'Brilliant Boats'. Can you look out for the rhyming words?


