<u>Literacy – Reading, Writing</u>	<u>Maths</u>	<u>Knowledge and Understanding of the World</u>
<p>This week at school would have been learning all about the Little Red Riding Hood story. At home you could:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read the story together. (lots on you tube) or follow link to this e story on twinkl. https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-t-12325-little-red-riding-hood-ebook Talk about what happened first, next, after that and at the end. Encourage your child to write short sentences to retell the story. Encourage them to sit writing on the line, use finger spaces between words, spell words themselves using the phonic sounds they can hear and to finish with a full stop. Always encourage your child to read back what they have written to check it makes sense. https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/au-l-53517-little-red-riding-hood-sequencing-differentiated-activity-sheets Act out the story in your house or garden. Different family members could be the different characters in the story. 	<p>It is important that your child continues to count, order and make sets to match each number to 20. You could print out the number and picture cards below or make your own on paper. Can your child :- Order 1-10 then 11-20? Write out each new calculation you make.
