The School Day

School starts at 8.55am. Children may come into school at 8:50 so they are ready in the classroom to start learning at 8:55am.

Lunch time is 12.15-1.10pm School ends at 3.15pm

Please be punctual both arriving and collecting your children. If you are unavoidably delayed please contact the school office. Staff will be in the playground to meet children and parents both at the start and the end of the day.

Lunchtimes

School meals may be paid for one week in advance on a Monday morning. Money should be sent in an envelope with your child's name, class and amount. The cost of a lunch is £2.00 and is therefore £10.00 per week. Alternatively you may provide your child with a packed lunch. If you think that you may be entitled to free school meals please ask at the office.

The Curriculum

At Simonside, every Year 5 child has a daily maths and literacy lesson. Literacy lessons involve the children developing their writing, reading, speaking and listening skills. The children also take part in drama activities to help stimulate ideas for written work. We will be reading a range of fiction and non-fiction books that link in with the topics for each half term.

In Year 5 the children have 4 numeracy lessons with the class teacher which involves all aspects of mathematics work including mental and written calculations.

For one maths session a week, the children have an Assertive Mentoring maths lesson. Here the children work with other children across the school who are working at the same level as them. All staff members across key stage 2 and Year 2 are involved in delivering these sessions. The children are often in much smaller groups in comparison to their normal class. The children are given a short test each week as part of these sessions. If they achieve 'green' standard (80% or above) three weeks running, the children are given the opportunity to move up into the next ability group.

Topic maps are on the school website for each class for each term. Where possible we try to link topic work in with the other subjects the children are doing. Please have a look at our blog as regularly as you can and we would also like to communicate with you via Class Dojo.

Homework

Literacy and Maths homework tasks will be set weekly. It will be set at a level that children can access for themselves; they may need encouragement to do their homework but shouldn't need help to complete it. All children should please ask for support at school (before the homework deadline) if they have been unable to complete their homework. Homework will be set on a **Friday** and returned the following **Wednesday**. If homework is not completed and returned to school for the deadline, then children will do a detention the same day.

The children also get a set of spellings each week to learn- these are usually given out on a Monday and tested on a Friday. It would also be beneficial if they could practise their multiplication tables as often as possible. Finally, if you could listen to your child read at home and ask questions about what they are reading, this would be highly effective in securing progress. Reading folders can be bought from school for £3.

Important days and dates for this academic year

Monday - Spellings given out

Tuesday - PE (PE kit needs to be in school).

Wednesday – Homework to be returned.

Friday – Spelling test and homework to be handed out. Swimming lesson – please bring swimming kit to school every Friday.

P.E. kit consists of a green t-shirt, black shorts and plimsoles. Trainers will also be needed for outdoor P.E. in September and the warmer months. It will be noted down if children don't have their P.E. kit (including P.E. shoes) and if this happens 3 times across a half term then they will be given a detention.

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
