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| <p><u>Challenge 1</u> https://www.freechildrenstories.com/i-like-to-go-exploring-1</p> <p><i>Once you have watched the video, 'learn the lyrics to the song.'</i></p> <p><i>Practice each verse at a time. Then practice the chorus. Then the next verse. Repeat daily until you know all of the words.</i></p> <p><u>Extension:</u> Record yourself singing the song and post to your story on Class Dojo. You can get dressed up as a hiker, use a microphone or even make your own video with pictures from challenge 2. <u>Have Fun!</u></p> | <p><u>Challenge 2</u> Make up your own lyrics. (Change the original ones slightly) Once you have changed the lyrics, sketch your own pictures to go with the new lyrics.</p> <p>Have fun with this and don't worry if they're not world class artistic pictures, just try your best.</p> <p><u>Extension:</u> Sing the new lyrics in your video.</p> | <p><u>Challenge 3</u> <u>Where have you explored before?</u></p> <p>Looking back through time, can you identify some places 'around the world' or 'close to home' that you could write about?</p> <p>Write a list of places you have explored. What did you see there? Any wildlife? Landmarks? etc.</p> <p><u>Extension:</u> Print out a picture of somewhere you have explored. Using the picture at the centre of a spier diagram, write as much as you can remember about this place.</p> <p>Tips: Use lots of adjectives, extend your sentences using conjunctions (while, so, since, who)</p> <p><i>e.g. I saw a beautiful waitress in the restaurant <u>who</u> was serving all of the hungry customers.</i></p> |
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| <p><u>Challenge 4</u></p> <p>Explorer? 🤔</p> <p>What does it mean to be an explorer? Do you know any famous explorers?</p> <p>Find out as much information as you can about some famous explorers. Pick your favourite three and write a fact file about each one.</p> <p>e.g. Who were the first explorers to climb Mount Everest? (<i>What was the story behind their successful summit?</i>) Which explorer discovered America? (according to history)</p> | <p><u>Challenge 5</u> <u>Map Challenge:</u></p> <p>Using google maps, find an ariel view of your local area.</p> <p>Great explorers use maps to plot their journey!
