Starting Reception Class in September

School starts on Tuesday 7th September. Children who have had a full time place in our Nursery will automatically move to a full time place in Reception from the first day. New children to our school will normally phase in over the first week building up to full time. Mrs Berryman will already have had individual conversations with parents regarding this. We feel these staggered times give the children the chance to build up to a full day at school. If your child is not managing at any stage of this process, we will come to arrangements on an individual basis with you.

The School Day

Reception classes are on the left hand side of the school through the tall wooden gates. The gates will be open each morning at 8.50am and a member of staff will be at the canopy gates to greet your child. Please do try to be on time. Gates and doors will be locked promptly at 9am so that we can start our day in the classroom. If you arrive after the gates are locked, please bring your child to the main entrance of school.

At the end of the school day please collect your child from the Reception classroom canopy doors at 3.00pm prompt before collecting older children in school. Staff will pass children over to parents one at a time so please be kind and give us a wave so we can make the whole process quick and easy for everyone. Thank you.

Your child's attendance at school becomes statutory once they are in Reception. We do ask that you make every effort to bring your child to school on time every day. If your child is poorly, please ring school before 8.55am to let the staff know of their absence. Holidays are not permitted during term time.

Your new classrooms

We have 2 Reception classrooms full of wonderful resources for your children. There are many areas to play and explore such as the reading areas, construction areas, make and do, writing and mark making, maths zone, fiddling fingers zone, puzzle zone. We also have a fabulous new canopy which runs along the whole Early Years side of the building. Reception and Nursery classrooms have access doors into this area which gives children opportunities to play on a larger scale than indoors no matter what the weather.

<u>Lunchtimes</u>

All children in Reception are entitled to a free school lunch. The children have a choice of meals each day and this is a good way of encouraging even the fussiest of eaters to try a range of foods. In the first week of term you will be given the 3 week rolling programme of lunches to choose with your child. These will then be the lunches your child will be given each week. Please speak to a member of staff if your child has a specific dietary requirement.

If you choose for your child to have packed lunches, this must be for a whole week at a time. Children can not alternate days of packed lunches and school lunches.

The Curriculum

The EYFS curriculum is your childs first steps into learning beginning at birth and finishing at the end of their Reception year. There are 7 areas of learning. These are :-

Personal, social and emotional Development Communication and language Physical Development Literacy Maths Understanding the World Expressive arts and Design

Everything your child will do whilst in Reception is planned using the objectives from the statutory frame work for EYFS. The expectation is that children will have achieved the Early learning Goals by the end of their Reception year. The EYFS curriculum has been updated for September 2021. Please see the parents letter sent home and on the website which explains this.

Recepion Topic Themes:

Phonics

This year we will be using a scheme called Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised to teach children how to read and spell across the school.

The majority of the Autumn term will be based on learning the sounds that individual letters make and each letter sound has a picture associated with it to help the children remember. We will be sharing this with you so that you can help to support your child at home. We ask that you use lower case letters and stick to the sounds they make not the names of the letters at this stage.

Homework

Once children are settled into their new class, they will be given a homework book which will have either Maths or Literacy based homework for your child to complete. This will be to consolidate learning from that week in school. Your child will need support from an adult to complete their homework. We do ask that the homework book is kept in a safe place whilst at home and children are not allowed to draw freely in it. Reading books and decodable/tricky words books will follow later in the year.

We will also send home a list of websites and on line programmes with passwords for your child. These will support learning in the classroom. Each week we will share on our class story dojo page what the children have been learning so that you can support them further at home.

To encourage a love of reading and sharing stories, your child will also bring home a library book of their choosing to share each week.

The homework will be given out on a **Friday** and needs to be returned by the following **Wednesday**. Your child will need a book bag to bring homework home.

What should my child wear?

We do ask that children are dressed in school uniform every day. Please do not let your child wear necklaces, bracelets or hooped earrings for school as these can be dangerous if they get caught on something.

Easy Shoes

When buying shoes please consider whether your child will be able to get them on and off by themselves. Many shoes now have velcro fastenings. Shoes that are flat and rubber soled, make it safer for your child to climb.

Names in clothing

Please write your child's name in <u>ALL</u> clothing they have at school including coats and shoes. Many shops now sell fabric pens that don't wash out or iron on labels that you can put inside clothes.

Absence from School

If your child is absent from school, parents must telephone the school office by 09.00am.

- Contact school as soon as possible to let us know the reason why your child is absent and how long they are likely to be off for.
- Without an explanation the absence will be marked as UNAUTHORISED.
- Children should not return to school for 48 hours after the last occurrence of sickness.
- Please arrange to take family holidays during school holidays. Permission will not be given for holidays during term time.
- Please try to organise all Dentist and non-urgent Doctors' appointments outside of school time. If you need to take your child out of school before 3.15pm, you will be required to fill in a form at the school office explaining the reason for the early collection.

Children in early years spend a significant amount of curriculum time outdoors engaged in physical activity. They have access to a range of equipment and play resources which develop gross motor skills of jumping, balancing, skipping, throwing, catching, kicking, riding a bike etc.

Once the children are settled into school we will be having PE sessions in the hall also where we will ask children to come to school already dressed in jogging bottoms, school PE t shirt, school jumper and trainers. We will let you know nearer the time which day of the week this will be.

How will COVID-19 change things?

There are a number of things which have changed in accordance with the government guidance. These measures are designed to keep all children and staff safe. A full list of protocols can be found in the new Home School Agreement. The following measures will aply to Reception children.

- 1. Children will need to wash their hands when they come into school on a morning.
- 2. Children only bring to school their packed lunch (if they are not on dinners), a water bottle, their reading folder and a waterproof coat. Equipment such as pencil cases should not be brought to school children will be given their own equipment.
- 3. Children will be asked to regularly wash and sanitise their hands.
- 4. Staff are advised to maintain social distancing between themselves and children/other adults.
- 5. Staff will wear PPE to administer First Aid or to change children after a toilet accident.
- 6. Any children displaying symptoms will be brought to an isolation room. Parents/carers will be contacted immediately and asked to collect their child. The child will then need to have a COVID-19 test. Further details on this can be found in the Home School Agreement.
- 7. There is a one-way system around the school building.
