<u>Reception and Rec/Y1 - Spring Term.</u> This term planning and teaching will focus on the skills mentioned in each of the 7 areas of learning. We will also be following the exciting themes of

Animals - I wonder which animals live in hot and cold places in the world, which animals live on zoos, farms and at home with us?

Winter and Spring - I wonder what happens outside during these seasons of the year? What happens to plants, animals and us during these seasons?

SPECIFIC AREA - Understanding the World

We will be finding out all about animals that live in the arctic regions as well as those that live in Africa. We will be comparing what these places are like and how they are different to where we live. We will be learning about animals that live with us and animals that live on a farm.

We will also be celebrating Chinese New Year when we will be encouraging the children to taste new foods and explore the similarities and differences between families, communities and traditions

We will be observing changes in the weather during Winter and Spring time.

SPECIFIC AREA - Expressive Art and Design

We will also continue to teach the sounds that letters of the alphabet make and will be encouraging the children to...

Hear and say the initial, middle and final sounds in short words including words with these sounds (ff, II, ss, ck, ng, sh, th, ch)

Link sounds to letters, sounding the letters of the whole alphabet.

Write all letters correctly from memory.

Blend the sounds in simple words to read and segment the sounds to spell.

Write own full name as well as family names and other words of meaning to them including things such as labels and captions.

SPECIFIC AREA - Maths

Our main focus is on counting skills and knowledge of numbers. Children will be working on numbers to 20.We will be encouraging the children to

Count objects accurately to 20 and beyond.

Make sets of objects to match numbers 11-20.

Recognise, read and write numbers accurately to 20 and beyond.

Estimate how many in a group and check by counting.

We will also be working on the following skills........

Addition Subtraction

Use everyday language related to money. Begin to count up with 1p and 2p coins.

Uses familiar objects and common shapes to create and recreate patterns.

Experiment with and order items by weight. Understand the capacity terms such as full, half full, nearly full, nearly empty. Compare items by capacity.
