

## YEAR 2 ENGLISH - READING AND COMPREHENSION

Reading assessment evidence in Y2 should focus on: regular listening to and discussing a wide range of poetry (both contemporary and classic), stories, plays, non-fiction books, whole books, fairy stories, traditional tales,. Children should have opportunities: for role-play based on reading, to develop a love of reading, to choose books to read, establish accurate and fluent word reading skills, to learn common exception words, retell a wider range of stories that have been read to them and discussed, learn how readers can check for sense, broaden vocabulary, discuss cause and effect in narrative and non-fiction and develop comprehension.
