The dog was the first animal to be domesticated (kept as a pet). This happened during the Mesolithic period of the Stone Age.

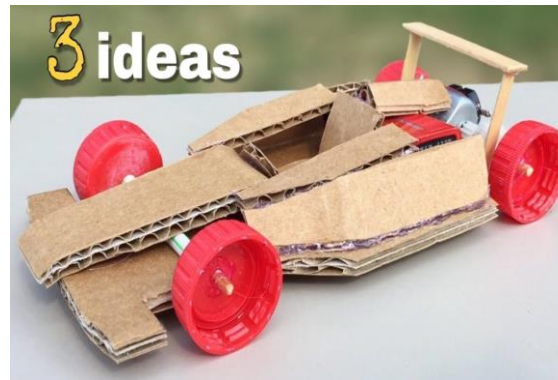
What is your favourite pet?
