History/Geography

This half term the children will understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography of a region or area within Europe.

We will set off on a voyage of discovery to Europe as we learn about the countries, culture and geography of this fascinating continent. We will learn about the climate, the geographical features, the industries and the people of Italy through a range of fun activities, giving an insight into how life in Italy is different to life here in the UK.

Geography Skills: Name and locate the continent Europe and the countries within it, specifically Italy and its identifying human and physical characteristics. Identify and describe how the physical features affect the human activity within a location. Describe how locations around the world are changing and explain some of the reasons for change. Describe and understand key aspects of physical and human geography. Create maps of locations identifying patterns.
