Challenge 5 (English)

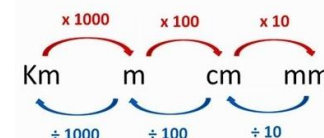
Read the text about these 4 incredible British female athletes and answer questions about them. This is a great way to practise your ability to skim and scan a text to find the answers.
