**Challenge 1: Science**



Sort a collection of items (water, items of food, coat, teddy, book, mobile phone, tv remote) to start a discussion about what animals need in order to survive. Then, sort the items into two groups. 'Things that animals need to survive' and 'Things that animals do not need to survive'. Remind your child that humans are animals!

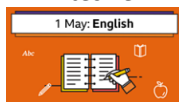
Where do Syd and Grandad sail to on the ship? What is an island?

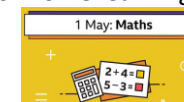
