Children will be using printing, collage and modelling techniques to create pieces inspired by our topic on the Romans

Skills (Art):

Design and paint a Roman shield

Know the significance of mosaics in Roman art

Generate repeating mosaic style pattern of coloured squares on a grid

Print a neat repeating border design with good technique

Make informed choices on colour and design based on prior knowledge and experience

Evaluate and analyse their work and the work of others

Design and finish printing a large scale mosaic style picture

Application of maths across the curriculum:

Measuring, symmetry, shape, pattern

Application of literacy across the curriculum: Reading, research, asking and answering questions, speaking and listening

MUSIC

Children will be learning to perform a range of songs linking to our topic on the Romans

Skills:

Sing new lyrics of Ode to a Roman Road to the familiar tune of 'Knees up, Mother Brown'.

Learn about the structure of songs.

Accompany the beat with a range of percussion instruments

Perform a rap: Romans on the march

Layer chant in 3 groups

Application of maths across the curriculum:

Topic (History)

Children will be learning about the Roman Empire and its effect on Britain.

Skills:

Identify different social classes of Ancient Rome and name some of the most famous emperors

Use a variety of sources of information

Locate countries on a map

Learn about invasion of Britain by Julius Caesar in 55BCE

Know about the benefits the Romans brought

Understand what life was like for Celtic people

Know vents of Boudicca's rebellion

Application of literacy across the curriculum:

Organise information into paragraphs

Ask and answer historically relevant questions

Produce info booklet about weapons, equipment and organisation of army

Role play Romans and Britons as invasion begins using a play script

Romans (Autumn 1)

Religious Education/ PSHE

RE

Children will learn that religious people belong to faith communities and express their sense of identity in a variety of ways

To identify sense of belonging in community

Look at a range of religious symbols form different religions

Explain why different symbols and artefacts are special to peoples' religious identity

Application of literacy across the curriculum: speaking and listening, writing under subheadings

PSHE

Application of literacy across the curriculum: speaking and listening, report writing

PE

Children will be learning about movement, agility, balance, coordination, accuracy, control and fluency and how these multi skills can be transferable to a range of different sports and activities.

Children will be performing a range of exercises and drills.

Skills:

Explore static balancing and understand the concept of bases

Combine a number of coordination drills using upper and lower body movements

To aim accurately using a variety of balls and equipment

Time running to intercept ball

Travel in different ways showing clear transitions between movements

Travel in different directions with control and fluency

Application of maths across the curriculum: measure, time, direction

The children will be recapping the basic skills in Computing

Skills:

Word Processing skills including typing using two hands, and formatting.

Saving and retrieving work from files and folders.

Copying work from one file to another.
